Week 1: Introduce Crazy Critters. Do you know of any creatures that live in the UK? Do all creatures live through Summer/Winter if not what happens?		iPad's Laptop A3 paper
Week 2: Children to work in groups and to go outside looking for minibeast and creatures. What can they find? Take minibeast/creatures to the bug house. Minibeast hunt taking tools outside.		Paper Pencils Gardening tools
Week 3: Children to look how we can attract creatures to the bug house. What materials do we need?		Paper Pen Gardening tools
Week 4: How do we look after snails? The life cycle butterfly. Once the caterpillars have arrived how we look after them. Changes do we notice? Once turned into butterflies set them free on the bug house.		Butterfly house
