
































Other enrichment opportunities

Enrichment activities in our school meet the needs of learners that go beyond the curriculum. They aim to give children experiences that otherwise they might not get. They help to give children fantastic speaking and listening opportunities and can also help to build their confidence.

Regular enrichment activities we offer include:

Forest School

From September we will be developing our Forest School's ethos. Small group learning in the great outdoors, where part of the focus is on bush craft, and part of the focus is on developing imagination. Staff will be trained in the practice and will use their skills with the pupils. Our understanding and experience of Forest School tells us that children love it and that the skills they learn make a difference to the progress they make back in the classroom. We have an amazing outdoor area on site and are very fortunate to have Boarshaw Clough and Hopwood woods nearby.

We are working towards the LOtC award. Mr Prendergast and Mrs Facchin will be developing our school in this area.

Sports

We believe children should be fit, active and enjoy competition in sport. Children get lots of great physical education through the curriculum (including swimming for year 4) but also have opportunities to take part in events with other schools. Throughout the year we provide a range of afterschool sports clubs for different year groups.

We have a sports council made up of pupils from different years.

Eco-School

Mrs Facchin and Miss Waugh are working with pupils to continue our journey as an Eco-School. Each class has elected representatives to be on our eco-council. The eco-council will be working hard this year to ensure that we are taking the best possible care of our school environment. We currently have the bronze Eco School award and will be continuing our work with Eco Schools.

Performing

All children get to take part in a performance during the school year. This may be a class assembly. Foundation stage present Christmas songs to parents, Key Stage 1 shone in their performance of 'Christmas with the Aliens' and Year 6 always amaze us with an end of year production.

Choir

From September 2015 Boarshaw will have its own school choir.

Gardening

We have a gardening club but all children get their hands dirty. Every class has a raised bed in which they plant and harvest vegetables. We also work alongside the local community allotment. They help us to grow and harvest crop that we can eat in school.

Trips, Visits and Visitors

We take up as many opportunities as we can to get children learning in interesting places and to get interesting people to come and help us learn in school. These include:

- visits to the library
- going to the theatre
- having theatre performances in school
- visits to the local area
- visiting the local church
- visit to local museum
- end of year trip
- visits from people who help us
- visits from authors and poets

The school Bank

Working alongside Royal Bank of Scotland, we run a school bank within school. This encourages pupils to save money and understand the importance of managing finances

School Council

Every year pupils from each year group are chosen to represent their class. We aim to give pupils a voice by encouraging them to bring forward their ideas. Mrs Facchin and Mrs Grime are responsible for the school council. In the past, the school council have been responsible for raising fund for playground equipment and deciding what to spend it on.

School Food Team

Pupil representatives work with Mrs Facchin and Mrs Evans to ensure that lunchtime is an enjoyable experience for all pupils. They ensure that we meet the School Food Standards, Test new foods introduced and find out what the other pupils think of our meals!

Community Champions

The Community Champions are ambassadors for the school. They work with Mrs Harland and Miss Hoskins. They are positive role models for the school and support our school and pupils in a range of ways.

Healthy School and Fairtrade

We hold a healthy school awards and work hard during the school year to promote healthy lifestyles. We are a Fairtrade school and ensure that our curriculum reflects this. Mrs Facchin and Mrs Beehan are responsible for the Fairtrade work within school.

Music

This year Years 2, 3 and 4 will be involved in whole class music tuition. They will learn to play clarinet, ukulele or a string instrument. This is something that we haven't done before and are really excited to see our pupils learn a new skill. We can't wait to see their performances.

Enrichment weeks

At Boarshaw Primary School we feel that great themed weeks are of great benefit to our pupils. In recent years we have held themed weeks based on The Olympics, The World Cup, Alice in Wonderland, WW2, The Jubilee, Diversity and Anti Bullying week.

In 2015-2016 we will hold one enrichment week a term. These will be –

Autumn term – PSHCE fortnight – Anti bullying work, road safety, Internet safety, PSRE

Spring Term - British Science Week (BSW) is a ten-day celebration of science, technology, engineering and maths - featuring fascinating, entertaining and engaging events and activities.

Summer Term – The Olympics – With a focus on Brazil, sport and a celebration of the cultural diversity of the Olympics.
