Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back, we hope you have had a lovely Christmas break. Last term we had lots of fun and learnt lots of new things. We celebrated all the different cultures in our class, took part in nursery rhyme week, were rock stars for the day, joined in with lots of children in need activities and created lots of our own Christmas crafts!



This half term we will discover how rainbows are made and where they come from, the different ways we can represent 3 and 4 and the different weather we can experience in Middleton. We will continue to explore different celebrations this half term such as Chinese New Year.

Please make sure you are reading with your child at home at least 3 times a week. This can be their reading book or a book that you have at home. Please record that you have read in your child's reading diary. Please ensure your child's reading book and book bag are in school every week so books can be changed. If you have any questions regarding reading books please speak to a member of the Early Years team.











TopicWhere do rainbows come from?

This half term our topic is 'where do rainbows come from?'

During this topic we will look closely at the artist Wassily Kandinsky. We will explore the different pieces of art work that he created and the children will have a go at creating their own piece of art work in the style of Kandinsky. We will learn the colours of the rainbow and take part in a variety of colour mixing investigations.

We will look at the different types of weather we see in Middleton and children will be able to talk about their own experiences of weather. We will read lots of books based around weather and talk each day about how the weather is outside.

Mathematics

Last term we looked into the numbers 1 and 2. This half term we will look closely at the numbers 3 and 4. We will look at how these numbers look, how we can represent these numbers and the different combinations we can make using these numbers.

Communication & Language / English

This half term we will reading lots of different stories as well as having a focus on Nursery Rhymes. Each week we will have a story of the week and these books will link to our topic 'where do rainbows come from.' Children will take part in activities based around our stories. We will encourage them to join in with well known repeated phrases in stories and nursery rhymes that we have sang in class.

Children will take part in group guided reading sessions where we will look at a book, read together and talk about the story we have read. We will look closely at the features of a book and encourage the children to talk about these features.

As the weather is still cold and wet, please continue to send in spare clothes. Especially socks! Please make sure all clothes are clearly labelled.
