If you would like an additional book each week for your child to read at home please speak to a member of staff. It is really important that you write in your child's reading record so we can keep an accurate record of your child's home reading.

## Maths in Reception

We have spent a lot of time this year working with numbers to ten. We are now introducing teen numbers. We will begin to understand that they are made up of 10 and a bit and look at how this related to the way we write the numerals. We will practice saying the numbers in the correct order and use this to help us count larger amounts of objects. Try to talk about and use numbers every day. How many steps do they go up to go to bed? How many sausages do you need to cook for all the family? What number can you see written on the bus driving past? How many times can they throw and catch the ball before they drop it?
