Spring Term 1

We would like to welcome everyone back and we hope that you have had a great Christmas break! We are looking forward to starting a new term and learning lots of new things. The children loved learning about different celebrations and getting ready for Christmas. Well done to all of the children who took part in our Early Years Nativity performance, they were all amazing!

Topic

What would it be like to live in the Polar region?

This half term we will be learning about the Polar regions and what the weather is like. We will be exploring our local area and comparing this to the Polar regions.

Also, we will be look at how we can keep warm when it is cold and which materials would work best. The children will also explore melting and freezing by doing a number of experiments.

English

This half term we will be looking at a variety of books linked to our whole class topic. These books will include the nonfiction book "Penguins" and "Lost and Found" by Oliver Jeffers.

We will explore different books and discuss key events in stories. The children will learn about the different features of a book, such as the title, author and illustrator. We will also discuss different characters thoughts and feelings at specific events in stories. We encourage children to share their thoughts on books so that we can better understand the types of books that they enjoy engaging with.

Phonics

We will continue to look at different letters and sounds. We will be using this to complete our phonics work books and helping us to read and write words.

Mathematics

In mathematics this half term we will be exploring the numbers 6-8. We will be finding, representing and subitising the numbers 6-8.

We will also be exploring length and height. This will include different ways that we can measure, as well as comparing length and height of different objects.

Number blocks is a useful tool to assist your child in their understanding of numbers. These can be found on BBC iPlayer.
