Model to children how a fossil is created using playdough and layers of sand and soil. Share images of archaeological digs and explain to children the job of an archaeologist what they do and what they look for. Share some images of fossils and encourage children to match them to the correct animal.	What are dinosaurs called and how are they different? (UTW) (CL) Ask children if I can go to the zoo or another country to visit a dinosaur. Why can I not visit a dinosaur. Clarify understanding of the vocabulary extinct. Share some images of different dinosaurs. How are they similar/different? What do children already know about dinosaurs? What dinosaurs can they name?
