













## EYFS Long Term Plan

Question	Nursery	 <p><b>Who lives in my house?</b> Children talk about the people who live in their house and the people who are important to them. The talk about special people in their families. They explore different types of houses and materials used for making houses. They explore what it is like around their house and understand the local environment. Children explore the people that might visit their house including people who might help them.</p>	 <p><b>Who can help us?</b> Children explore the different people who help us. Including how we our friends and adults in school can help us. We learn how to be a good friend to others. We learn about the emergency services and how they can help us. We also learn about the people who help to keep our bodies healthy. Children also think about what they want to be when they grow up.</p>	 <p><b>Where do rainbows come from?</b> Children explore the weather and how the weather around us changes. They will explore colours and how to changed colours. They will learn about different types of weather around the world and look at some weather extremes. Children will explore puddles and what happens to puddles.</p>	 <p><b>How do I get about and how do things move?</b> Children explore forces and how things move. They compare how they move and how animals move. They explore how toys move and what makes them working including understanding the use of electricity and wind up mechanisms. They think about the different modes of transport they use. They explore which transport we would use for different things. They explore how we would travel to a different country.</p>	 <p><b>What happened to Jack's beans?</b> Children will explore plants and how these grow. They will think about what Jack's beans needed in order to grow well. They will look at different flowers and talk about the features and purpose of these. They will grow different plants including bean plants and sunflowers. Children will think about which foods come from plants and try different foods.</p>	 <p><b>What would you find on the farm?</b> Children think about what animals Old McDonald had and learn the names and sounds of each animal. Children learn about the reasons why farmers keep different animals. Children learn about life cycles of some animals and the names of animal babies. Children will also learn about vehicles on the farm including tractors.</p>

	Reception	 <p><b>What do I know about me?</b> Children explore the ways in which we are all the same and the ways in which they are different. They think about what makes a family and how all families are different. They think about what they look like focusing on detailed drawings of themselves. They talk about and express their opinions on what they like and don't like. They think about their heritage and where different people come from. They explore homes and how our home may differ from people around the world. They also explore all the things they can do with their bodies.</p>	 <p><b>What do different people celebrate?</b> Children explore traditional English celebrations and celebrations from around the world. They will explore major events from the past and learn about how these have shaped the world we live in today. They will think about how they celebrate birthdays and how this is different around the world and in different religions. Children will experience different foods and cultural events</p>	 <p><b>What would it be like to live in the Arctic?</b> Children explore a contracting location (the arctic). They look at maps of our local area and how these are different from the arctic. They compare and contrast the different locations looking at homes, transport and jobs. They think about how we would keep warm and explore the properties of materials. Children explore scientific concepts melting and freezing.</p>	 <p><b>What happened long ago?</b> Children will learn about their place in history. They will look at some significant events in local and national history. They will learn about events that happened a long time ago such as dinosaurs and will learn about significant events such as the space race. They will learn about how life was different in the past through exploration of artefacts.</p>	 <p><b>Are all mini-beasts scary?</b> Children will learn about the features of different mini-beasts. The will learn about spiders and understand why they spin webs. They will look closely at features of different mini-beast including worms, snails and ladybirds. They will also learn about the life cycle of a butterfly and the importance of bees. Children will also learn about habitats and how to look after animals habitats.</p>	 <p><b>What is it like at the seaside?</b> Children will learn to compare and contrast life in Middleton and life at the seaside. They will also compare seaside in this country and others. They will learn about typical features of the seaside and how this has changed since the past. They will learn about sea life and how we need to protect this. Children will learn about the dangers of plastics in our oceans.</p>
