

- Irrigation: the process of supplying water to land or crops to help growth.
- Tractor: a powerful vehicle used in farming for pulling heavy loads and machinery.
- Fertilizer: a substance added to soil to increase plant growth.
- Harvest: the process of gathering mature crops.
- Pesticide: a chemical substance used to kill pests that can damage or destroy crops.
